

amNewYork: NYC, EmblemHealth to pay \$53M worth of copays back to 250,000 city retirees in new settlement

In “amNewYork: NYC, EmblemHealth to pay \$53M worth of copays back to 250,000 city retirees in new settlement” (amNewYork, August 3, 2026), amNewYork discusses the \$53 million settlement agreement between New York City, EmblemHealth, and a class of roughly 250,000 elderly and disabled municipal retirees submitted to New York County Supreme Court on Friday.

Between January 2022 and January 2023, New York City imposed \$15 co-pays on retirees enrolled in GHI Senior Care, a city-funded Medicare supplemental plan offered through EmblemHealth’s Group Health Incorporated.

Steve Cohen of Pollock Cohen and Jake Gardener of Walden Haran Williams, who represented the retirees in litigation, challenged the imposition of those co-pays, securing one of the largest settlements against the City of New York in history.
