According to Steve, "As insurance companies become increasingly aggressive in their use of prior authorization—whether to boost the bottom line or to control improper spending—they need to be held to the same standards of good-and-appropriate medical practice as doctors. It shouldn't require a triple amputation to spur our political representatives to take responsibility for their oversight." Cohen represents the family of Kathleen Valentini in this matter.
